What to Bring on Your Lady Washington / Hawaiian Chieftain Passage

Passages are one of the most exciting adventure travel experiences offered by the *Lady Washington* and *Hawaiian Chieftain*. You'll get a sense of life aboard an 18th-century tall ship traveling along a coastline, sometimes out of sight of land. Though the food is great and companionship wonderful, there's no shuffleboard, swimming pool, or waiters in white jackets. We'll do our best to make you comfortable, but there are few luxuries.

General Tips On Packing

A soft duffel bag makes ideal luggage, because you can easily stuff it into a locker. A duffel also makes some nice padding in the tight bunks during stormy weather. Be ready for any conditions; it's always colder than you'd expect out on the water. Bring plenty of layers so you can adjust your clothing to suit the weather. Wool and polypropylene will keep you warm even when wet; cotton and other synthetics will not. And even when it's chilly, the sun is strong; sun protection is important.

Suggestions for Clothing and Personal Items

- Towel / washcloth
- Laundry bag
- Toiletries
- Sun hat / sunscreen / sunglasses
- Two pair of eyeglasses (one is a spare), if needed, with durable cases
- Flashlight (red lens if possible)
- Wool watch cap
- Photo I.D.
- Prescription medications
- Sturdy shoes (tennis shoes/hiking boots)
- Bedroll or sleeping bag
- Pillow
- Foul weather gear (rubber boots, warm coat, pants, and hat)
- Camera
- Journal/log book
